Robert Baxt Brings the Funny

For our February lecture, we're lucky to have local favorite, **Robert Baxt**, as our featured speaker.

Robert believes it isn't what you do, it's how you do it! As a full time working pro all his life, he truly believes that real people just want to be



entertained; so he will focus on presentations of his original takes on effects. There will be no card tricks and no knuckle busting sleights, only commercial entertainment and laughs. As a winner of a FISM Trophy for Comedy, his rule is "Funny is Money".

Robert is proud of the fact that he has never had a "real" job. After putting himself through college with money he earned from performing, he was presented with the dual opportunities of being accepted to both Ringling Bros. Clown College, and to Law School. Without hesitation, he chose the one that would better for his comedy career: Law School! But after graduating with a juris doctorate degree and taking the Bar exam, Robert never practiced and proceeded on to a full time career in show business.

With his comedy magic act, he won both the 1st Prize in the National I.B.M. Gold Medal Stage Competition (Lance Burton handed him the trophy and Robert claims it still has his DNA on it!), followed the next year by a FISM trophy for Comedy in Madrid, Spain.

He has performed in Las Vegas, Comedy Clubs, Colleges, Cruise Ships, and on TV and at Magic Conventions around the world. He has a line of Comedy Magic Routines available for other performers at <u>www.robertbaxt.com/shop</u> and writes jokes for other performers.

HEATING UP YOUR MAGIC BY 'ONE DEGREE' John Guastaferro Shows How Small Changes Produce Big Results

The temperature inside everyone's homes during Assembly 291's January virtual meeting was presumably mild, but thanks to John Guastaferro it felt more like One Degree.

Guastaferro, the club's guest lecturer, is not only a magic creator and frequent headliner at the Magic Castle but the author of several books on magic, including the acclaimed One Degree (as in, one degree from a boiling point), which focused on small, incremental shifts that transform good reactions into great reactions.

For the Westside Wizards, he focused on effects from his book En Route, which continues the One Degree philosophy. "I don't think a trick is ever done," Guastaferro said, citing the ever-evolving need to create ideal magical experiences for audiences. "We might



perfect the handling, but we're always en route to perfect our performance."

Guastaferro's principles for approaching such perfection boil down to simplicity (cutting out the fat), artistry (making certain an effect is beautiful to watch, even when nothing magical is happening), and creativity (a fun plot and presentation). "We can probably all do thirty minutes with a deck of cards," he said, "but I like to make sure that thirty minutes feels diverse, and that it's not just the standard plots."

Sometimes that means using the card box as a prop, or personifying the cards. Other times it's small presentational changes; referring to volunteers by name, waiting an extra beat during a pause, or inserting moments of silence. "This idea of one degree, it's not just handling," he said. "It's also how you interact with your audience." With that in mind, Guastaferro uses a light touch during card manipulations since "I don't want the audience to feel tense if I'm trying to do a double-lift."

Guastaferro's lecture featured several signature effects, including Virus (a "hacked" card deck can't return to normal until "deck support" magically removes the virus), Box Whisperer (a card appears inside an empty card box after someone whispers its name into the box), and Mini-Mental (a multiple-selection routine where Guastaferro "reads minds" to magically produce four cards). In each case, he demonstrated how he altered standard premises to either personify the effect or make deeper connections with an audience.

He also took time out to teach his stylish "Ballet Cut," which "reminds me of a pirouette across the stage." Considering how many Westside Wizards are now en route to one-degree changes, Guastaferro certainly stuck the landing. – Dan Cray
